Revi is working with her and the family to support them, helping with social and financial assistance. E has also started coming to our church group.

Fulani Ministries, Burkina Faso: Boureima & Susanna Diallo and their family

Based at the Jam Tan Centre, they train Fulani Christians in discipleship, church planting and practical skills and provide education and healthcare for the local community.

We thank God that we have recently been able to begin a new children's club at Jam Tan, called Jam Naati, receiving 500 children ages 3 to 18 each Saturday.

Prison Fellowship: Chris Coverly

Chris leads a team from TBC, who support Prison Chaplains in three local prisons, also helping to deliver the PF victim awareness course, "Sycamore Tree", in those prisons.

Give thanks:

For the blessing the Sycamore Tree course (Restorative Justice) has been in Thameside prison. The offenders are keen to learn, many expressing a desire to change their behaviour. They were particularly challenged by hearing a victim of crime story on week three, and how the victims have coped and moved on, meeting their offenders and choosing to forgive them.

For the start of a Sycamore Tree course in Rochester prison, and the completion of s Sycamore Tree course in Belmarsh prison.

Please pray:

Ask God to bless those who are letter writers to offenders. Pray that positive relationships will be built through their future letters.

The week starting the 5th February was Childrens' Mental Health Week. Remember all the children with a parent in prison and young people who are in prison themselves.

Ask God's blessing over their lives and for His healing power over those who are experiencing mental health challenges.

For those whose lives have been devastated by a prison sentence, which has led to mental health issues, and attempted suicide. Pray that God will bring healing and peace and those alongside who can give guidance and hope.

Remember young people in prison who will sign up for Angel Tree Mothers Day. Ask that God would help strengthen weakened family ties and bring hope to those relationships.

As we begin the season of Lent, we pray Lord that this would be a time for us to draw closer to God, to refrain from distractions and to look with more compassion on the needs of the world, especially within prison.

Mission Rwentobo, Uganda: Hope Community Clinic

TBC teams have built, established and support Hope Community Healthcare Clinic in Rwentoho.

Give thanks:

For positive feedback from Dr Ian Spillman and Hanna who have been in Uganda for the last 3 months. They have been very encouraged to see the work at the clinic which is increasingly busy with some overnight admissions to manage the seriously ill.

They return to UK in time to share their news at the Musical Fundraising Evening on 16 March at TBC.

The clinic team took part in a medical camp in an adjacent village on 25 January where they screened 108 people for various diseases and found 12 with hypertension, 2 with diabetes, 1 with HIV and 3 with signs of possible cervical cancer or pre-cancerous changes.

Follow up was organised for all of these. Midwife Brenda has now returned to the clinic, having been trained to use the ultrasound scanner which was donated for use in the clinic and the community.



Please pray:

For the team who are preparing for the musical fundraiser. Please pray for an enjoyable evening with good attendance and no technical issues.

For Kisiizi hospital as they cope with staff shortages in the finance department due to maternity leave for the finance officer and sick leave for her replacement following a road traffic accident. Hanna Spillman was able to give support and now Malcolm from the UK but more local staff are required in this area. Kisiizi also look after the finances and salaries for the clinic.

For the building engineer who is expected to do the work to repair the clinic walls and enhance the building to extend maternity services. He has been busy on another project which is nearly completed. Please pray that he or an alternative trustworthy engineer will soon be available to oversee the required work.

We will be applying to the Jephcott Charitable Trust in March for funding towards full maternity care. Please pray that all the required costings will be received from Kisiizi and the application will get a favourable response when considered in early April.
